



A Korean teaching social studies in an international school in Hong Kong, Ana joined the Master of Education program for its strength in cultivating practical habits for the classroom.


Each class has brought her eye-opening insights that she has been able to apply to her classroom, from inclusion to creativity in education.

Program structure

Cohort learning

Throughout the duration of the program, students will study together with the same group (the cohort), going through the same courses together in the same sequence. This has the benefit of building a strong sense of community within the learning cohort.

Hybrid learning

Our model of hybrid learning combines face-to-face instruction with online learning. Each course in the program begins with several classes of face-to-face instruction and is supplemented by online learning, which offers greater flexibility on your time. This involves learning through a multimedia platform, discussions with peers and faculty, peer reviews of papers, and more.



Course highlight

Framing Questions, Global Forces, Constraining Structures

This course will examine key issues surrounding the nature of a good society, the ways in which the global community affects education, and how schooling gets structured by politics and economics. It will use the faith-based frames of justice and hope in connection with shalom and the kingdom of God to investigate formal education in light of its political, economic, social, and religious contexts. Students will investigate foundational questions around teaching, learning, curriculum, and language as well as structural issues of social class, gender, ability, and race.

Faculty spotlight

Dr. Max Hui-Bon-Hoa

PhD, Languages in Education, University of London, UK

"It's important to be creative in everything we do, because in that sense we are really imitating God."

Dr. Max Hui-Bon-Hoa teaches in the Master of Education program. He has an extensive educational and teaching background in English, American literature, and education.

Dr. Hui-Bon-Hoa was born and raised in Hong Kong, then went on to earn various qualifications in the U.S. (Stanford University for his bachelor's and three master's degrees, and Harvard University for a CAS degree). He also earned his PhD in the U.K.

Dr. Hui-Bon-Hoa has also been actively involved in teaching, having taught at Tunghai University and National Taiwan University in the early 1980s, followed by the University of Hong Kong, where he taught English language and literature, between 1985 and 2012. In the past 20 years, he has also trained English teachers in Hong Kong, Macau, and mainland China.

Dr. Hui-Bon-Hoa currently teaches literature at the School of Professional and Continuing Education (SPACE, affiliated with the University of Hong Kong), teaches the Bible as literature at Ladder Mission, and conducts teacher-training in various parts of China. In addition, he has written, translated, and edited 20 books.



Dr. Hui-Bon-Hoa finds that his M.Ed. students are curious, creative, and invested in strengthening their students' faith.
